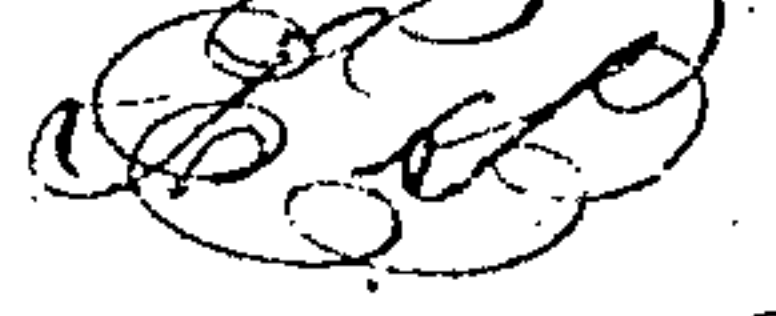


The State of Alabama This Indenture made and
 Shallice County entered into the 13th day of
 April 1859 between John H. Mot debtor of the
 1st part and John H. Mot creditor of the
 2nd part witnesseth that whereas the
 said party of the 1st part is justly indebted to
 the party of the 2nd part in the sum of forty
 two 5/100 dollars by promissory note dated this day
 and payable on or before the 25th day of
 December 1859 and the said party of the 1st
 part being desirous to secure the payment
 of said indebtedness for and in consideration
 thereof and for the further consideration of
 the sum of one dollar to the said party
 of the 1st part in hand paid by the said
 party of the 2nd part the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged the said party of the
 1st part has sold and hereby sells and con-
 -veys to the said party of the 2nd part the fol-
 -lowing described property to wit two cows and
 calves one red and one other red and white
 mule and a horse and one mule the same
 in any possession and the crop of cotton to be
 raised by me the consent year subject
 to the said party of the 2nd part for rent to
 have and to hold in trust as follows It is hereby
 agreed that the said party of the 1st part
 is to have and retain possession of the said
 property until the 25th day of December 1859
 and if the said party of the 1st part shall
 fully pay to said party of the 2nd part said
 debt with interest thereon and the reasonable
 expenses hereof by said 25th day of December
 1859 then this Indenture is to be null and
 void But upon default of such payment
 the said party of the 2nd part is hereby

authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving twenty days notice of the time and place of said sale by advertisement posted up at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of _____ and interest thereon and the reasonable costs hereof and the balance if any due to said party of the 1st part Given under our hands and seals this day and year above written
