

This indenture made & entered into this the 18th  
 day of April AD 1859 between Danl. W. Prentice  
 of the County of Shelby & State of Alabama and  
 Fiddora Prentice his wife of the first part &  
 Peyton G. King of the same County & State of the  
 second part. Witnesseth that whereas the said  
 Daniel W. Prentice & Fiddora his Wife for & in  
 consideration of the sum of seven hundred and  
 fifty dollars the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-  
 edged have this day bargained and sold in fee  
 and conveyed and by these presents do bargain  
 and sell in fee and convey unto the said  
 Peyton G. King his heirs and assigns forever the fol-  
 lowing described tracts and parcels of Land forever  
 that is to say the East half of the South ~~East~~ quarter  
 of Section 26 the West half of the South West quarter  
 of Section 25 the North East quarter of the North  
 East of Section 35 and the North West quarter of the  
 North West quarter of Section 36 all of which  
 said lands lie on the Cahaba River in the  
 Tuscaloosa Land District and in Township

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21 and Range 5-Met and contains Two hundred and forty (240) acres more or less - And we do covenant with the said Peyton G King that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforesaid granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrance that we have a right to sell and convey the same and that we will warrant and defend them against the lawfull claims of all persons whatever.
