entered into this 3^d day of Oct 1859 between
H. J. Bosley debtor of the first part and B. W. Adams
creditor of the second part witnesseth That
whereas the said party of the first part is justly
indebted to the party of the second part in the sum
of Eighty Dollars due by promissory note and
payable on or before the 20th day of October 1859
and the said party of the first part being desirous
to secure the payment of said indebtedness; for
and in consideration thereof and for the further
consideration of the sum of one Dollar in hand
paid by the said party of the second part
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. The
said party of the first part has sold and hereby
sells and conveys unto the said party of the
second part the following described property
to wit: 1 Iron Gray Horse roached man and
about 6 or 7 years old. to have and to hold
the in trust as follows: It is hereby agreed that
the said party of the first part is to have and
retain possession of the said property until the
20th day of October 1859. and if the said party
of the first part shall fully pay to the said
party of the second part is hereby said debt
with interest thereon. and the reasonably

Expenses hereof by said 3^d October 1859. Then this Indenture is to be null and void. But upon default of such payment the said party of the second part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder, for cash, after giving Ten days notice of the time and place of said sale by advertisement posted up at three public places, and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of Eighty Dollars and interest thereon and the reasonable costs hereof, and the balance if any pay to the said party of the first part.
