into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1860, between Thomas  
H Brasher and Elizabeth Brasher husband and wife  
of the first part, and Abner Allick H Brasher of the  
second part: witnesseth: That the parties of the first  
part, for and in consideration of the sum of One  
Dollar to them in hand paid by the party of the second  
part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have  
sold, and hereby sell, confirm and convey, unto  
the said party the following described land lying  
in Shelby County, State of Alabama, to wit:  
The NE 1/4 and the E 1/2 of the NW 1/4 and the W 1/2  
of the SE 1/4 all in Section One Township 22 Range  
One West, to have and to hold to said second party,  
his heirs and assigns forever, the above described and  
hereby granted lands and premises. And the said  
parties of the first part, husband and wife, hereby  
covenant with the said party of the second part  
that we are lawfully seized of, and have good right  
to sell and convey, said land, and hereby bind  
ourselves, our heirs and legal representatives forever,  
to warrant and defend the title to said land and  
premises to the party of the second part his heirs  
assigns and legal representatives, against the claim  
of all and every person in law or equity, and  
against the government of the United States.
