 into this 7th day of March 1860 between William Russell
 debtor of the first part, and Pelton O. Nabors creditor
 of the second part witnessed: That whereas the said party
 of the first part is justly indebted to the party of the second
 part in the sum of One hundred & twenty seven dollars due
 by a Promissory Note bearing even date herewith
 and payable on or before the 1st day of January 1861
 and the said party of the first part being desirous to secure
 the payment of said indebtedness: for and in consideration
 thereof, and for the further consideration of the sum
 of one dollar to the said party of the first part in hand
 paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the
 first part has sold, and hereby sells and conveys to the
 said party of the second part, the following described

property to wit one Gray Mare Mule one
 yoke of oxen both black. one ox waggon
 now in the possession of David Russel to have
 and to hold in trust as follows it is hereby
 agreed that the said party of the first part
 is to have and retain possession of the said
 property until the 1st day of January 1861.
 And if the said party of the first part shall
 fully pay to the said party of the second part
 said debt with interest thereon and the
 reasonable expense hereof by said 1st day
 of January 1861 then this indenture is
 to be null and void but upon default
 of such payment the said party of the
 second part is hereby authorized to take into
 possession and sell said property to the
 highest bidder for cash after giving ten
 days notice of the time and place of said
 sale by advertisement posted up at three
 public places and out of the proceeds of
 said sale retain the said sum of
 one hundred & twenty seven dollars
 and interest thereon and the reasonable
 costs hereof and the balance if any pay
 to the said party of the 1st part given
 under our hands and seals this day
