 and Malinda his wife of the one part and Samuel
 A. Curry (son of the before named Alexander Curry and
 Malinda his wife) of the same place of the other part,
 witnesses; That the said Alexander Curry and
 Malinda his wife, for and in consideration of the
 mutual love and affection which they have and
 bear unto the said Samuel A. Curry and also for
 and in consideration of the sum of Five dollars
 to them in hand paid by the said Samuel A. Curry
 at and before the executing and delivering hereof
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and also
 for and this further consideration, to wit. That whereas
 the said Malinda the said wife was formerly
 married in lawful wedlock to one William Thomas
 and at the time of said marriage with said Thomas
 she held to her own use and separate use and benefit
 a negro girl Leah by virtue of a deed of gift made
 and delivered to her by her Father John D. Moore
 which said deed is now on record in Probate Court
 of Jefferson County of the State aforesaid which negro
 Leah became before the demise of her first husband
 the mother of eight children, and that the said
 William Thomas by consent of his said wife
 at and before his decease in month July 29th
 day AD 1843 by his last will and testament
 granted & devised to the then lawful heirs of
 his body all the above named property to wit
 the said Leah and her children, and that whereas
 the said Alexander Curry and the said Malinda
 his wife were lawfully married about the close
 of the year 1847 and by said wedlock had unto
 them born the said Samuel A. Curry and whereas
 the said Malinda and her husband Alexander
 desires to make and place their her said son
 Samuel A. Curry as regards her property vested
 in her by virtue of said gift from her Father in a
 condition equal to and altogether as good as that
 of her children born to her during her first
 cohabitation with said Thomas. Now these premises
 intended moving the said Alexander Curry and

This wife Malinda, they have this day given granted and confirmed and by these presents do give grant and confirm to the said Samuel A. Curry all and singular two Negro Slaves to wit one Girl Sabrey age about sixteen years and one boy named Ezekiel age about eight years. I have hold and enjoy all and singular the said Slaves unto the said Samuel A. Curry his executor, administrator and assigns for ever. And this gift of Slaves is in no wise or on no account to be made or considered as an advancement in law to the said Samuel A. Curry or is it in no way to detract from any legacy that may afterwards by the granting be made to said Samuel A. Curry or if the said granting die intestate this gift shall not prevent said Samuel A. Curry from a full and equal distributive share with all the other heirs born to said Malinda Curry during her first marriage in the estate of said Malinda Curry. And me the said Alexander Curry and his wife Malinda all and singular these Slaves Sabrey and Ezekiel to the said Samuel A. Curry his executor, administrator and assigns against us. the said Alexander Curry and his wife Malinda our executor & administrator and all other persons whatsoever. with warrant and ever defend by these presents In witness whereof we have this day hereunto set our hand and seal
