 to wit, A Negro woman, slave called Matilda of light complexion
 about 19 years of age more or less, and her two children Laura a
 girl about 2 years of age, and Fred a Boy about 4 months
 of age, to have and hold to said M. McClanahan Trustee as aforesaid,
 and his successors as such Trustee in trust for the sole, separate
 exclusive and only use of said Elizabeth Randall and the heirs
 of her body forever. Witness my hand and seal this 11th day of
