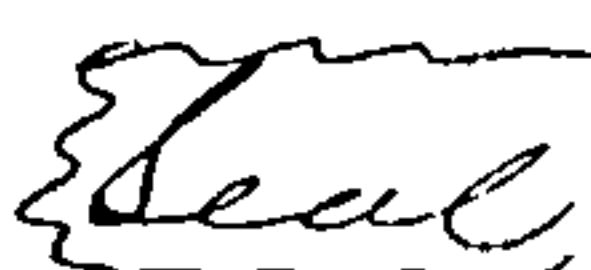
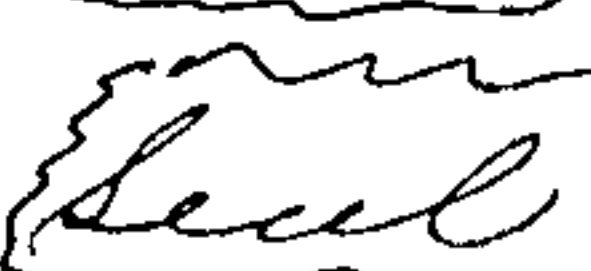

 of two thirds to Hambro and one third to said Bassett the
 following tract or parcel of land lying and being in the
 district of land subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Ala. & in the
 County of Shelby to wit. the North East quarter of the North
 West quarter of Section thirty one, in Township No. Twenty of
 Range No. two East Containing forty 1/2 Acres more or less
 to have and to hold the before granted land to said Hambro
 & Bassett in the manner as aforesaid, and to their heirs and
 assigns forever. And the said William R. & Mary Palmer their
 heirs & representatives, do Covenant with said Hambro & Bassett
 their heirs & assigns that they are lawfully seized in fee
 simple of the before granted premises that they are free from
 all incumbrances whatever that they have a good right
 to sell and convey the same to the said Hambro & Bassett
 And further they their heirs & representatives do hereby warrant
 and defend the title to the above conveyed land forever

against all persons whatsoever claiming the same, In witness whereof
