

This Indenture made and entered into between George H. Alexander of the first. David Smith Trustee of the second part, and Sylvester Steele of the third part. Witnesseth: That whereas the said party of the first part is indebted to the party of the third part, in the sum of Sixty Seven dollars and nineteen Cents due by note, dated this day, written due on the 25th December 1861. And being willing and desirous to secure the payment of said debt to said Steele hath granted bargained sold and conveyed and doth by these presents grant bargain sell and convey unto the said David Smith Trustee one roan Horse, aged about three years to have and to hold him said Smith forever. Now the Condition of the above is if said George H. Alexander pays or causes to be paid said debt specified above, together with the Costs of this deed by the 1st January 1862, this deed is void and of no effect. But if not paid by said specified Time the Trustee is authorized and empowered to advertise said Horse for sale, for Cash to the highest bidder, after having given ten days previous notice of sale, on the door of the Drug Store at Montivalls, and apply the proceeds of said sale to the payment of said debt, and if any remains in hand of Trustee after paying as aforesaid, is to be paid to the first party.
