by these presents doth give grant sell and convey
unto the said party of the second part the following
property to wit One negro Girl named Hannah about
about Eleven years old of dark complexion To have
and to hold to her sole and separate use and benefit
forever - In testimony whereof we have hereunto
set my hand & seal This 18th day of August AD 1861.
