 Whereas Joseph Gray of Shelby County has deposited in
 the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate
 of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa showing
 it appears that full payment has been made by the
 said Joseph Gray according to the provisions of the act
 of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an act making
 further provision for the sale of the Public lands for
 the East half of the North East quarter of Section twenty
 eight in Township twenty four of Range thirteen East in
 the district of lands offered for sale at Tuscaloosa
 Alabama containing seventy nine acres and eighty six
 and half an acre according to the official plat
 of the Survey of the said lands returned and returned to
 the General Land Office by the Surveyor General
 which said tract has been purchased by the said
 Joseph Gray Now Know ye that the United States
 of America in consideration of the premises and in
 conformity the several acts of Congress in such cases

made and provided have given Granted and by
 these presents do give and grant unto the said Joseph
 Guy and to his heirs the said tract above described
 We have and to hold the same together with all the
 right privileges emanations and appurtenances of
 whatsoever nature hereunto belonging unto the said
 Joseph Guy. In Testimony Whereof I John Quincy
 Adams President of the United States of America
 have caused these letters to be made Public and the
 seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
 Given under my hand at the City of Washington
 the first day of December in the year of our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
 six and of the Independence of the United States the
 fifty first year By the President J. Q. Adams
