 No 17252 To all to Whom these presents shall come
 Greeting Whereas John Thomas of Shelby County Ala-
 -bama has deposited in the General Land Office
 of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the
 Land Office at Tuscaloosa whereby it appears that
 said John Thomas has been made by the said John
 Thomas according to the provisions of the Act of Con-
 -gress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled an Act making
 further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands
 for the North East quarter of the South West quarter
 of Section Six in Township Twenty Three of Range
 fourteenth East in the District of lands subject to sale
 at Tuscaloosa Alabama Containing forty Acres and
 Thirteen and therefore the record of the same
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said
 Land, returned to the General Land Office by the
 Surveyor General, (which said tract has been purch-
 -ased by the said John Thomas) Now Know ye
 That the United States of America in Consideration of
 the promises and in conformity with the several
 Acts of Congress, in such Cases made and provided
 have caused and by these presents do give
 and Grant unto the said John Thomas and to his
 heirs the said tract above described to have and
 to hold the same together with all the rights, power
 and immunities and appurtenances of whatever
 Nature, Therunto in anywise unto the said John
 Thomas and to his heirs and assigns forever
 In testimony Whereof I Martin Van Buren Pres-
 -ident of the United States of America have caused
 these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the
 said General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
 Given under my hand at the City of Was-
 hington the twenty eighth day of August in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
 thirty eight and of the Independence of the United
 States the President Martin Van Buren

 Whereas Edmund King of Fuller County has deposited in the
 General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the
 Register of the Land Office as follows: Whereas it
 appeared that full payment has been made by the said
 Edmund King according to the provisions of the Act
 of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled "An Act making
 further provision for the Sale of the Public Land, &c."
 The West half of the South East Quarter of Section Six in
 Township Twenty Three of Range Ten East in the District
 of Land Subject to Sale at Tusculum Alabama Contain-
 ing eight acres according to the official plat of the
 Survey of the said Land, returned to the General
 Land Office by the Surveyor General, (which said
 tract the said King purchased by the said Edmund
 King for himself) That the United States of America
 in consideration of the Premises and in conformity with
 the several Acts of Congress, in such case made and
 provided have given and granted and by these
 presents do give and grant unto the said Edmund
 King and to his heirs, the said tract above described:
 To have and to hold the same together with all the
 rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of
 whatever nature, thence hereunto unto the said
 Edmund King and to his heirs and assigns forever.
 In Testimony Whereof Andrew Jackson President
 of the United States of America have caused these
 Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General
 Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

 and thirty four and of the Independence of the
 United States the fifty ninth Andrew Jackson
