

Certificate of the United States of America
 No. 5495. To all to Whom These presents shall come
 greeting Whereas Joseph Gray of Shuler County has
 deposited in the General Land office of the United
 States a Certificate of the Register of the Land office at
 Tusculum, Tennessee, it appears that full payment
 has been made by the said Joseph Gray according
 to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 31st of
 April 1820 entitled an act making further provision
 for the sale of the Public Lands for the West half
 of the South West quarter of Section twenty eight
 in Township twenty four of Range thirteen

in the district of land offered for sale at Tuscaloosa
Alabama containing seventy nine acres and eighty
up and one half hundredths of an acre according
to the official plat of the survey of the said land return
ed to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General
which said tract has been purchased by the said
Joseph Guy. Now know ye that the United States of
America in consideration of the promises and in
conformity with the several acts of Congress in such cases
made and provided have given and granted and
by these presents do give and Grant unto the said
Joseph Guy and his heirs the said tract above dis-
-cribed to have and to hold the same together with
all the rights franchises immunities and appurtenances
of whatever nature thenceunto belonging unto the
said Joseph Guy and to his heirs forever.
In testimony whereof I John Quincy Adams Pres-
-ident of the United States of America have caused
these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the
General Land Office to be hereunto appended.
