Dyke a creditor of the second part (Witnesses that when the said party of the first part is fully indebted to the party of the second part in the sum of One Certain Note given to H. M. Nelson for forty dollars given the 13th of Oct 1860 and due twelve months after date and the said party of the first part desires to secure the payment of said indebtedness for and consideration thereof and for the further consideration of the said party of the second part the following described property to wit one acre of open land known as the Ranney - apends and 1 stock wheel carriage and hooks to have and to hold in trust as follows to be having good that the said party of the first part do to have and retain possession of the said property until the 1st day of March 1867 and if the said party of the first part shall fully pay to the said party of the second part said debt with interest thereon and to personally appear here by said 1st day of March 1867 then this indenture is to be null and void but upon default of such payment the said party of the second part is hereby authorized to take into possession and keep for his own property given under my hand and seal the day and year above written.
