

This indenture made and entered into this 19th day
 of November 1866 between the undersigned heirs
 declarantes and legatees of James Williamson dec
 eased late of Shelby County State of Alabama of the
 first part and Martha E. Williamson widow and
 next of the said James Williamson dec of the second
 part (hereafter that whereas the said James
 Williamson dec did on the 15th day of November
 1865 make declarator and publish his last will and
 testament of which he gave and bequeathed to the
 said Martha E. among other things the following
 described lands to wit the south half of S E 1/4 of
 Section 2 and the S E 1/4 of S W 1/4 of S W 1/4 of Section 1
 divided by Commencing at the S W Corner and
 many irregularly through said forty acres to the
 N E Corner of said forty acres in Section 1 and the
 N E 1/4 of Section 11 all in Township 20 of Range and
 not to her during her natural life as widow
 -hood but in the event she married again to
 return to his estate that after the death of said

Williamson said will now spend for protest and
the said Martha & her up about to dissent from said Will
and to claim dower and distribution in said estate under
the Statute (Whampon) is now agreed between the parties hereto
that the said Martha & should withdraw her dissent and
relinquish dower and distribution under the Statute and
let and claim under said Will only the W & of Section
11th dissolved in and the parties of the first part keep all
the lands at law of the said James Williamson quit
claim to and convey the said W & of Section 11th Township
28 of Range and West Containing one hundred and eighty
acres more or less to have and to hold the same to her heirs
and assigns forever and the said relinquishment by
the said Martha & having been made and the said Will
having been protested now for third in consideration
of the promises of the first part do hereby convey all right
title and interest which they have or could claim in and
to said W & of Section 11th as her at law of James Williamson
to the said Martha & Williamson forever to have and to hold
the same in absolute right forever given under our hands
and seals this day and year first above written
