 of said County and State as the surviving partner
 member of the firm of Morgan & Worthington
 said firm using this style formally in the
 business of grocers and merchants in the town
 of Monticello in said County and Benwell
 B Davis of the second part witnesseth;

whereas the said firm of Morgan and Northington
is greatly indebted to the firm of Hatch Kiss Gurney
Bennett in the sum of two hundred and seventy
seven 14/100 dollars with interest thereon as evidenced
by a certain promissory note made by said firm
on the 22 day of September A.D. 1860 and payable
on the first day of January next after date
at the Office of Butler and Kith of New York
with Current Exchange on New York for said sum
of ~~two~~ hundred and seventy seven 14/100 dollars &
the said John P Morgan on behalf of said firm
as a fore said being desirous to pay the aforesaid
transit debts due by his said firm it was in Consider
of the premises as well as in Consideration of the
sum of Twenty dollars to him in hand paid
by the said Bennett B Lewis the Receipt whereof
by the said John P Morgan is hereby acknowledged
he the said John P Morgan hath bargained
and sold assigned and transferred and by these
premises doth bargain sell transfer and assign
unto the said Bennett B Lewis the following
Claims debts and demands to wit: 1st One

 with interest from January 1st 1862 to have and
 to hold the said Notes claims and demands hereby
 mentioned and assigned unto the said Burrill & Lewis
 Lewis his Representatives and assigns for ever in
 trust however and for the following use, intent
 and purpose 1st the said Burrill & Lewis may
 proceed to sue on the claims here in transport
 using in said suit the name of the said John
 P. Morgan or the firm name of said said suit
 may require he may compromise any all of said
 claims as in his judgment may seem desirable

giving in his name receipt and discharge to any of the parties owing the same either upon payment or sum promised with him of said claims or any of them. Second the monies arising from the claims and demands being transferred when collected by said Burrill B Lewis shall be paid out by him as follows 1st the expenses of this trust and all necessary expenditures in its execution. 2d to the payment of the claim of Hookkins Lemuel & Bond here in before described, 3d the balance if any there be to be accounted for by the said Burrill B Lewis to the said J P Morgan according to said trustworthy column of the parties here to of the first & second part here unto set their hands and seals the first of the second part being the attorney of the person & firm whose claims are herein described and holding said claims as such for collection and having authority to do act accept the trust here in declared for himself and on behalf of said creditors this the day and year above written

Shelly County } being engaged in raising a crop of corn and cotton in Shelly County Ala and Messrs Butler and Kelly of Wilsonville Ala having advanced to me the sum of five hundred dollars for the purpose of cultivating said crop

and having agreed further to advance to me
 at market value as much as may be needed
 to complete said crop which without said
 advances it would be impossible for me to
 make my crop I have this day sold and
 conveyed unto them their heirs assigns and
 administrators all of my right title and interest
 in said crop of corn and cotton raised
 by me during the present year 1867 the said
 crop or so much as may be needed to pay
 off said advance to be delivered at Warsawville
 Ala or such point as may be designated by
 said Butler & Kelly on or before the 15th day
 of Nov next next by them sold the proceeds
 or so much as may be necessary to be applied
 to the payment of said advance for supplies and
 the remainder if any to be paid over to the
 undersigned in testimony whereof I have here
 unto set my hand and seal this the 15 day of
 April A.D. 1867
