 the said party of the first part is justly indebted to
 the party of the second part in the sum of sixty
 Dollars due by promissory note on the 25 day of
 December 1868 and payable on or before the 25 day
 of December 1868 and the said party of the first
 part being desirous to secure the payment of said
 indebtedness; for and in consideration hereof and
 for the further consideration of the sum of
 one dollar to the said party of the first
 part paid by the said party of the second
 part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 the party of the first part has sold and conveyed
 sells and conveys to the said party of the second
 part the following described property to wit: one dark
 bay mare right eye out, white star in the face
 six years old to have and to hold in trust as follows
 It is hereby agreed that said party of the first part
 is to have and retain possession of the said property
 until the 25 day of December 1868 and if the said
 party of the first part shall pay to the said party
 of the second part said debt with interest thereon
 and the reasonable expenses hereof by said 25 day
 of December 1868 then this indenture to be null and
 void but upon default of such payment the said
 party of the second part is here authorized
 to enter into possession and sell said

to the highest bidder
 property for Cash after giving fifteen days
 notice of the time and place of said
 sale by advertisement posted up at three
 public places and out of the proceeds of
 such sale retain the said sum of the
 above note
