 sixty five & 2/100 Evidenced by a promissory note
 made by said Weeks and payable to said Nabors
 for said sum of two hundred and sixty five & 2/100
 and bearing even date with these with these presents
 and due the first day of November 1868 and the said
 Weeks being anxious and desirous to secure said Nabors
 in the future and prompt payment of said note at
 maturity and for and consideration of the sum
 of one dollar in hand paid by the said
 Nabors the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 hath bargained sold and conveyed and by
 these presents doth bargain sell and convey
 unto the said Nabors the following Real Personal
 property to wit: The two 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Sec 21 Township
 21 Range 3 West. Also the South half of Section 18 T 21 R 3
 West all in Shelly County Ala. And also growing crop
 of Cotton and Corn on said lands and other lands
 for this year (about thirty eight acres in cotton & about
 fifty acres in Corn) And also (2) two yoke of Steers, One
 of said yoke of Steers was bought by F Nabors from
 Messrs the other yoke was raised by the said
 Nabors. To have and to hold unto the said Nabors
 his heirs and assigns forever. Now the Conditions
 of the above Conveyance is such that if the
 said Weeks shall make default in the payment
 of said promissory note at its maturity the said
 Nabors is hereby authorized and empowered to take
 possession of said property instantly and sell the
 same at public outcry to the highest bidder for cash
 in the town of Montevallo Shelly County Alabama
 after giving twenty days notice of the time and place
 of said sale by written advertisement posted up in
 said town of Montevallo and appropriate the
 proceeds of said sale to the payment of

the Cost of this Conveyance & the said Promissory Note & interest due thereon. But should said Weeks pay off & discharge said Promissory Note on or before the same falls due then this Conveyance to be void & of no effect, otherwise in full force and effect.
