and the same was obtained by the undersigned when the agreement, and in consideration of this instrument and good faith for the purpose of making a crop and that without such advances it would not be in the power of the undersigned to procure the necessary provisions labor stock and supplies to make a crop the present year. Now in consideration of the premises & the undersigned, A. J. Gentry do hereby grant bargain and sell to the said A. R. Brown & their heirs of good ordinary or low middling Cotton averaging five hundred pounds to the bale securely packed and in good marketable condition the same to be the first picked on my premises at the then market price of such Cotton in the Town of Montevalle and the said A. J. Gentry obliges himself to deliver the said Cotton to the said A. R. Brown on the 1st day of Nov 1870 in the Town of Montevalle And to better secure the said A. R. Brown in the payment of the full value of said Cotton at the time stipulated for its delivery & above stated & the undersigned A. J. Gentry in consideration of said advances do sell and convey and hereby grant bargain & sell to the said A. R. Brown the following personal property to wit: All the growing crop of Corn and Cotton the mules horses and farming utensils of the said A. J. Gentry, Now on his premises Witness our hands & seals this the 1st day of May 1870
