The State of Alabama This Indenture Made and
Shelby County 3 Entered into this 5th day of
May 1870 between Ansey Jacob @ debtor of the
first part and Green W. Lee Creditor of the
2nd part. Witnesseth: That whereas the said party
of the first part is jointly indebted to the party of
the 2nd part in the sum of Two hundred & 20⁰⁰/₁₀₀
Dollars due by account for Supplies and
payable on or before the 1st day of December
1870. and the said party of 1st part being desirous
to secure the payment of said indebtedness for
and in consideration thereof, and for the
further Consideration of the sum of one
Dollar to the said party of the 2nd part, in hand
paid by the said party of the 2nd part, receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged the said party
of the 1st part has sold and hereby sells and
conveys to the said party of the 2nd part the
following described property to wit: All
his interest in the Crop of Cotton Corn oats
and Potatoes and Fodder raised by him in
Connection with J. P. Murphy for the present year
to have and to hold, in Trust as follows: It
is hereby agreed that the said party of the 1st
part is to have and retain possession of the
said property until the 1st day of December
1870 and if the said party of the 1st part shall fully
pay to the said party of the 2nd part said debt with
interest thereon and reasonable Expenses hereof
by said 1st day of December 1870. Then this indenture
is to be null and void. But upon default of
such payment the said party of the 2nd part
is hereby authorized to take into possession
and sell said property to the highest bidder for
Cash, after giving 30 days notice of the time and
place of said sale by publication in a newspaper
if one published in the County, or by posting at
three public places, and out of the proceeds of said

Said retain the sum of Two Hundred Dollars
and interest thereon and the reasonable costs,
and the balance of any pay to the said party of the
first part.
