that whereas A. R. Brown has this day advanced
to the undersigned Abner Reese his farming
implements provisions goods wares and
merchandise to the amount of Twenty
dollars and agrees to further advance
to the undersigned from time to time
during the current year supplies goods
wares and merchandise to the amount
of Twenty dollars and whereas the said
advances are obtained by the undersigned
of the said A. R. Brown to enable him to
make a crop this ensuing year and the
sum was obtained by the undersigned
when the agreement and in consideration
of the execution of this instrument and
in good faith for the purpose of making
a crop and that without such advances
it would not be in the power of the
undersigned to procure the necessary
provisions labor stock supplies to make a
crop the present year. Now in consideration
of the premises & the undersigned Abner
Reese (Fid) do hereby grant bargain and sell
to the said A. R. Brown (Ct) Twenty four Bushels

of good sound corn in good condition
 Consideration the sum to be the first gathered
 on my premises at the then market price
 of such corn in the Town of Monticello, and
 the said Abram Reeves obliges himself to deliver
 the said corn to the said A. R. Brown on the
 1st day of Nov 1870 in the Town of Monticello
 And the latter to receive the said A. R. Brown
 in the payment of the full value of said
 corn at the time stipulated for its delivery
 as above stated. & the undersigned Abram
 Reeves in consideration of said advance
 as seen and convey, and as hereby grant
 bargain & sell to the said A. R. Brown the
 following personal property to wit: All the
 growing crop of corn, & one yoke of oxen
 & other cattle, farming utensils of the said
 Abram Reeves, shown his premises,
 Witness our hands & seals this 8th day
 of Aug. 1870
