The State of Alabama Whereas R. R. Hanley & Bros
Shelby County San Antonio, indebted to W. W.
& M. Kidd Adms of A. R. Cohill deceased the
Sum of Three hundred and thirty & 4/100 dollars
with interest as more fully appears by a certain
promissory note given by said Hanley & Bros to said
Adms for the said amount, and dated Oct 12th 1870
and made due on the 1st day of January 1872 with in-
terest from Oct 12th 1871 when said note matured
the said Hanley & Bros are anxious & desirous to
secure unto the W. W. & M. Kidd Adms. as aforesaid
And therefore know all men by these presents
that in consideration of the premises, as well for
the consideration of the sum of five dollar store
in hand by said Adms the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged we the said Hanley &
Bros have bargained & sold by these presents as
bargain and sell unto the aforesaid W. W. and
M. Kidd Adms the following described horses
to wit One dark brown Stallion about 8 years old
and one black gelding about five years old
To have & to hold said Stallion & gelding but
upon trust nevertheless; and on the following con-
ditions - that the said Hanley & Bros and retain
possession of said Stallion & gelding until said
note becomes due and default be made in
the payment thereof. Either in part or in whole
when and in which event, the said W. W. & M. Kidd
Adms are hereby fully authorized & empowered to
take said Stallion & gelding into their own
possession and sell them for cash to the highest
bidder after fixing the time & place of said
sale, & giving ten days notice thereof out of
the proceeds of said sale, pay & satisfy said note
& interest & the cost of this instrument; and the
balance if any pay over to said Hanley & Bros
or to their order. But should said note be paid
when due and no default be made in the
payment thereof then this obligation shall be
void but otherwise to continue in full
force & virtue in law.
