 to James Dye a deed Conveying all the property
 real and personal owned by her viz all her property
 personal and real of which she is possessed and all
 dues and claims to which reference is here had
 and has delivered the possessions of the same to
 said James Dye. Now therefore in Consideration
 of the premises the said James Dye agrees and
 hereby binds and obligates himself to support &
 maintain in good and comfortable manner dur-
 ing her life the said Dionny McDonald furnishing
 her with the necessary food raiment and medical
 attentions needful for her health Convenience and
 Comfort also to furnish her with good comfortable
 warm bedding and furniture and is to have
 her washing done and nurse and attend to
 her when sick or from any cause she is unable
 to attend to herself or when she wants assistance
 and it is agreed and understood that all of
 said expenses are to be paid and labor is to be per-
 formed by said James Dye and the said James
 Dye is also to give the said Mrs Dionny McDonald
 decent Christian burial at her death paying all
 expenses thereof - In testimony whereof the said
 James Dye has hereunto set his hand & seal
 this 5th day of January 1871.
