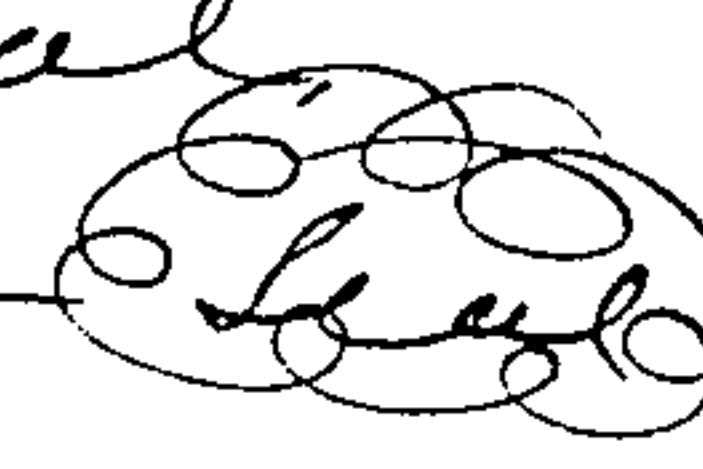

Shewy County 3 and entered into this
January 17th Decy 1871 between Clifton Barr
party of the first part and E. W. Attorney party
of the second part Witnesseth Whereas the said
Clifton Barr is justly indebted to the said
E. W. Attorney in the sum of forty five dollars
and no part in and account due on the first day
of November 1871 and the said Clifton Barr
being willing and desirous of securing
the same hath this day given the said E.
W. Attorney a deed in trust on the following
property, to wit 1st and gray mare a boat five year
old and one lot of Black Oxen about five
year old, Now the condition of the above obli-
gation is such that if the said Clifton Barr
shall fail to pay the above named debt
on or before the first day of November 1871 then
the said E. W. Attorney shall have power to take
the said property named in this deed in possession
and sell at public sale any for cash at any
place that said party may agree on by
giving 30 days notice of such sale or he
much thereof as will pay said debt and
charges and if the said Clifton Barr shall
pay the above debt by the first day of November

1871. Thus this obligation to be void in
