Shelby County, This Indenture Made and entered
into between Elih McCay (Col) of the first
part And John Corley of the second part all of
the State and County above written, Witnesseth
that the party of the first part has this day bought
of the second party one Black male age about
fourteen years for whom the first party has
executed his note for one hundred and ten
dollars bearing even date with these presents
and payable the first day of October next.

And whereas the first party is desirous
of securing to the second party his heirs &
assigns the faithful payment of said note
therefor & the said Elih McCay (Col) assigns
to the second party a mortgage on said male
and two Bales of Cotton even weighing five
hundred pounds to be delivered to the second
party on or by the first day of October next.

Now the Condition of the above mortgage is
that should said note or any part thereof remain
due and unpaid on the first day of
October next the second party is to take
possession of aforesaid property, wherever found
and after ten days notice in Hartselle by
advertisement proceed to sell the same for
Cash and after paying out of proceeds of said
first the cost of this mortgage then the remainder
of the debt due and if any be left pay it
over to said McCay or his legal heirs or assigns
but in the event the said first party shall pay
or cause to be paid said note and cost of this
mortgage then this mortgage to be null and
void Else otherwise to remain in full force
and virtue.
