Shelby County And entered into this 29 day
of March 1871 between Henry Colville Col debtor
of the first part, and Dr W. E. McGraw Creditor
of the 2nd part, witnesseth: That whereas the said
party of the first part is justly indebted to the party
of the 2nd part in the sum of twenty nine & 6/100
dollars due by open A/c and payable over
before the 15th day of November 1871 and the said
party of 1st part being desirous to secure the
payment of said indebtedness for and in
consideration thereof, and for the further con-
sideration of the sum of one dollar to the said
party of the 1st part, in hand paid by the said
party of the 2nd part, receipt whereof is hereby ack-
nowledged the said party of the 1st part has
sold and hereby sells and conveys to the said
party of the 2nd part, the following described
property, to wit: All of his Corn and Cotton to be
raised by him the said Henry Colville to have
and to hold, in trust, as follows: It is hereby
agreed that the said party of the 1st part is to
have and retain possession of the said property
until the day of 1871 and if the said
party of the 1st part shall fully pay to the said
party of the 2nd part said debt with interest thereon
and reasonable expenses hereof, by said 15th day
of November 1871 then this indenture is to be

Mill and so on. But upon default of such payment
 the said party of the second part is hereby author-
 ized to take into possession and sell said
 property to the highest bidder for cash. After giving
 five days notice of the time and place of said sale
 by publication in a newspaper for published
 in the County, or by posting at three public
 places and out of the proceeds of said sale
 return the sum of twenty nine & 10/100 dollars
 and interest thereon, and the reasonable
 costs hereof, and the balance of any pay
 to the said party of the first part.
