 To Shelby County } and entered into this 6th
 G. T. Kelley & Co. day of April 1871 between Grant & Harper debtor
 of the first part, and Kelley & Co. creditors of the 2nd part
 witnesseth: That whereas the said party of the first
 part is justly indebted to the party of the 2nd part
 in the sum of Forty dollars due by open account
 and payable on or before the 15th day of October
 1871 and the said party of 1st part being desirous
 to secure the payment of said indebtedness; for
 and in consideration thereof, and for the further
 consideration of the sum of one dollar to the
 said party of the 1st part, in hand paid by the said
 party of the 2nd part, receipt whereof is hereby rec-

acknowledged the said party of the 1st part has sold
 and hereby sells and conveys to the said party
 of the 2nd part. the following described property
 to-wit: This entire Crop of Corn & Cotton for
 the year 1871 to have and to hold in trust, as
 follows: It is hereby agreed that the said
 party of the 1st part is to have and retain pos-
 session of the said property until the 15th day
 of October 1871 and if the said party of the 1st
 part shall fully pay to the said party of the 2nd
 part said debt with interest thereon and
 reasonable Expenses hereof by said 15th day
 of October 1871 then this indenture is to be
 null and void, But upon default of such payment
 the said party of the second part is hereby autho-
 rized to take into possession and sell said
 property to the highest bidder for cash. After
 giving 20 days notice of the time and place
 of said sale by publication in a newspaper
 if one published in the County or by posting
 at other public places, and out of the proceeds
 of said sale retain the sum of Forty dollars
 and interest thereon, and the reasonable costs
 hereof, and the balance if any pay to the said
 party of the first part.
