into this 24th day of February 1851 between
Robert T. Switzer debtor of the first part
and R. H. Glaze creditor of the second
part witness: That whereas the said
parties of the first part is jointly indebted
to the party of the second part in the sum

of Six hundred dollars due by two promissory notes, and payable as follows, 1st note for Three hundred and 25th day of December 1871. 2nd note for Three hundred dollars due 25th day of December 1872

And the said party of 1st part being desirous to secure the payment of said indebtedness for and in consideration thereof and for the further consideration of one dollar to the said part of the first part in hand paid by said party of the second receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said party of the first part husband and hereby sells and conveys to the said party of the second part the following described property "To wit" One Parcel and Every thing belonging thereto and all of the stock of leather and hides on hand at the time the notes fall due being in the town of Chempersville in said County to have and to hold in Trust as follows;

It is hereby agreed that the said party of the 1st part is to have and retain possession of the said property until the 25th day of December 1872 provided he pays the first promissory note at maturity with interest thereon and reasonable expenses hereof by said time. But upon default of such payment or payments of said indebtedness, the said party of the second part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash. After ten days notice of the time and place of said sale by posting in three (3) public places in said County, and out of proceeds of said sale ~~by posting in~~ retain the sum of Six hundred dollars and interest thereon and the reasonable costs hereof, and the balance if any pay to the said party of the first part.
