13th day of March A.D. 1871 Between R. L. Croft
of the first part and T. B. Milner of the second
part witnesseth that the said party of the first
part is justly indebted to the said party of the
second part in the sum of Ninety Nine 89/100
dollars due the 13 of December next and the
said party of the first part is willing and obli-
gued to secure the said party of the second part
and does so by giving him a sum on a
certain Black horse Mare about seven
years old, now known if the said party of the
first part fails to pay the above named sum
Ninety Nine 89/100 dollars so soon as it falls
due. It shall be lawful for the said party
of the second part to take charge of said horse
and advertise him and sell him at public
auction for cash giving fifteen days notice and
selling the sum at the said party of the first
part's residence and after having sold the
sum the proceeds thereof shall be applied
to the payment of said debt and after having sold
the sum should there remain in the hands
of the said party of the second part over and

above what will paid debt and cost of this trust he shall pay it over to the said party of the first part. In witness whereof the party of the first part have hereunto set my name affixed my seal day and date first above written,
