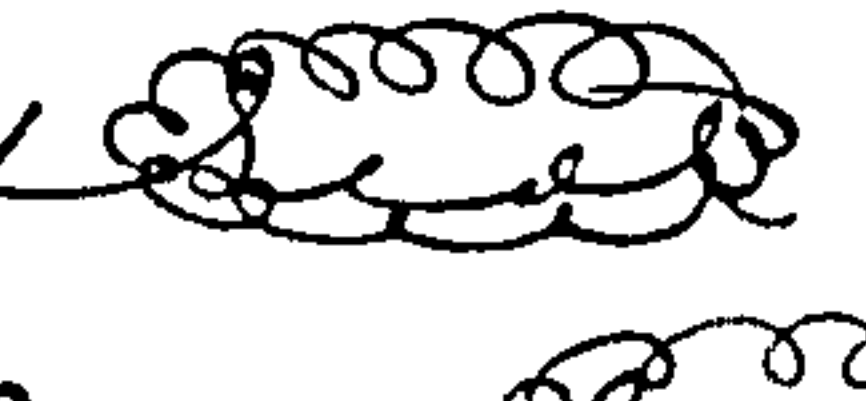
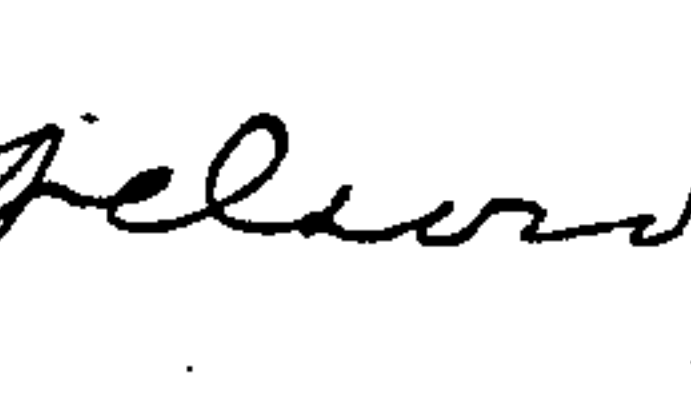
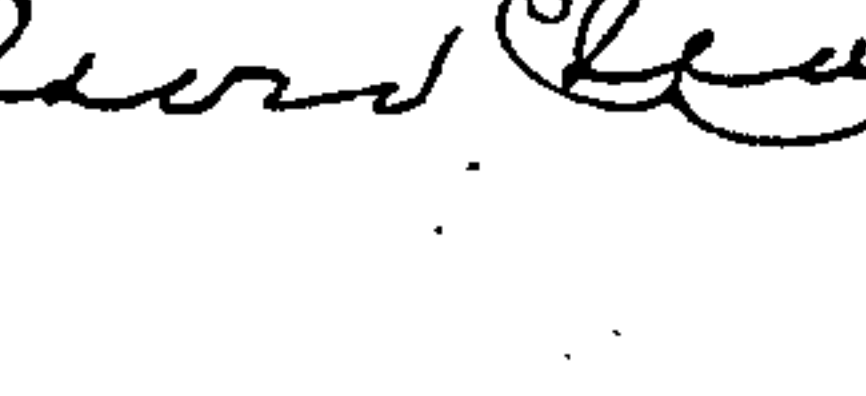

The State of Alabama, This Constitution
Shelby County, made and entered
into this 4 day of May 1891 between John
Nest debtor of the 1st part, and James D
Chesnut creditor of the 2nd part, with cith:
That whereas the said party of the 1st part
is justly indebted to the party of the 2nd part

and the sum of One hundred & Eight Dollars
 due by promissory Note due, ²⁴ day of Nov 1871,
 and payable on or before the ²⁴ day of Nov
 1871 and the said party, of the 1st part being
 desirous to secure the payment of said indebted-
 ness, for and in consideration thereof, and
 for the further consideration of the sum of one
 dollar to the said party, of 1st part in hand
 paid by the said party, of the 2nd part, the
 receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the
 said party, of the 1st part has sold, and hereby
 sell and convey, to the said party, of the 2nd
 part the following described property, to-wit:
 All the Crop Corn & Cotton to be raised by me
 on the Bigby Place by my labor or by Rent
 or otherwise 1871 also one wagon born Buggy
 to have and to hold, in trust as follows; This
 hereby agreed that the said party, of the 1st part
 is to have and retain possession of the said
 property until the 1st day of November 1871 and
 if the said party, of the 1st part shall fully pay
 to the said party, of the 2nd part, said debt with
 interest thereon and the reasonable Expenses
 hereof, by said 1st day of November 1871 ~~and~~
 then this Consideration to be null and void,
 But upon default of such payment the
 said party, of the 2nd part is hereby authorized
 to take into possession and sell said
 property to the highest bidder, for cash
 after giving Ten days notice of the time and
 place of said sale by advertisement posted
 up at three public places, and out of the
 proceeds of said sale retain the said sum of
 One hundred & Eight Dollars, and interest
 thereon, and the reasonable costs hereof, and
 the balance, if any, pay to the said party, of
 the 1st part. Given under our hands and
