The State of Alabama This indenture
 Shelby County E made and enter
 Ed into this 5th day
 of June 1871 between A. J. Britton debtor
 of the first part and Henry R Lyman
 Creditor of the second part. Witnesseth
 that whereas the said party of the
 first is Indebted to the party of
 the second part in the sum of
 Fifty three & 60/100 dollars and by prom
 ising note and payable on or before

the first day of November 1871 and the said party of the first-part being desirous to secure the payment of said indebtedness: for and in Consideration there of and for the further Consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said party of the first-part in hand paid by the said party of the second part receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said party of the first-part has sold, and hereby sells and conveys to the said party of the second part the following described property to wit: My Entire Crop of Cotton grown by me the present year on the plantation of ~~Rebecca~~ ^{Rebecca} to Mrs. Nancy Britton in Shelby County Ala to have and to hold in trust as follows: It is hereby agreed that the said party of the 1st part is to have and retain possession of the said property until the 1st day of November 1871 ~~then this indenture~~ ~~there is to~~ and if the party of the 1st part shall fully pay to the said party of the second part said debt with interest thereon and reasonable expenses hereof by said 1st day of November 1871 then this indenture is to be null and void: But upon default of such payment the said party of the second part is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving fifteen days notice of the time and place of said sale by posting at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the sum Fifty three ~~to be~~ ^{to be} dollars and interest and the reasonable costs hereof, and the balance if any pay to the said party of the first-part.
