 To Shelby County & more ~~and~~ ^{and} entire
 M. E. Donaldson ~~and~~ this Twenty-
 third day of November 1870 between
 the "Shelby Limestone Company" a Corpor-
 ation chartered under the laws of
 Alabama - of the first part - and
 Mrs A. E. Donaldson wife of Presley
 W. Donaldson of the second part -
 Witnesseth - That whereas the said
 Shelby Limestone Company on the 4th day
 of October 1861 procured from John F.
 M. Nelson and James K. Patterson an
 assignment of all the interest they had
 in and to the following described lands
 to wit - The west half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the North
 East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and the South East-
 fractional quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty
 one (21) Township Twenty two (22) and
 Range two west, Also the north
 west quarter of the North west quarter
 ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section one (1) and the South
 East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the North East
 quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and the North East quar-
 ter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$)
 of Section two (2) in Township Twenty
 four (24) and Range Thirteen East

Also the north-East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the North-East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) - Section Twenty (20) and the East half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the South West-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Seventeen (17) Township Twenty Two (22) Range (2) Two West - all in the

County of Shelby and State of Alabama and in the District of lands formerly subject to Entry at Tuscaloosa

Which said lands ~~Paterson~~ said Welch and Paterson had previously purchased from one Abram Bullitt and held same for title from said Bullitt with the understanding and agreement that the said "Shelby Lumber Company" should perfect their title to said lands and thereupon should make to the said Welch or to his ~~heirs~~ assigns quit-claim titles to certain portions of said lands hereinafter mentioned and to which said lands the said Welch had reserved his right and interest in said transfer or assignment. And whereas the said Welch afterwards to wit: on the 29th day of September 1863 assigned all his interest in said lands which had been reserved in the said transfer and all his rights under the said Contract to F. M. Gilmer Jr. and whereas the said Gilmer afterwards to wit: on the 8th day of March 1869 assigned one undivided one fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) interest in said lands and Contract to Mrs E. A. Donelson wife of Presley W. Donelson. Now therefore know all men by these presents that the said "Shelby Lumber Company" a Corporation as aforesaid in consideration of the premises above recited and for the purpose of carrying out the said Contract and agreement made with the said Welch as heretofore recited, and his assigns and for the further consideration of Five Dollars to the said Corporation in hand paid by Mrs E. A. Donelson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged

doth remise, release and forever quit-claim unto the said Mrs E. A. Donaldson on her heirs and assigns, all right, title, interest or demand of whatever description the said "Shelby Lumber Company" may have in and to the following described lands to-wit: one undivided fourth of all that portion of fractional Section Twenty one (21) (above specified) which lies northward of the Selma Rome & Dalton Rail Road and Eastward of the travelled road sometimes called the Harkins Road and also known as the Montgomery Road and leading towards the old mill site of the said Welch. To have and to hold the above released premises to the said Mrs E. A. Donaldson and heirs to her and their own use benefit and behoof forever.

In witness whereof the President of said Company has hereunto set his name officially and caused the seal of said Company to be affixed and attested by the Secretary of said Company the date herein first above written.
