The State of Alabama This Indenture
Shelby County Emanc and Entered into

Elth's 11th day of April

1871 by and between J. C. Wideman & Sarah Wideman party of the first part and Edmund Crumpton administrator of the Estate of Luke Crumpton decd Creditor of the second part all of the County and State aforesaid witnesses that Archibald Carter on or about the 13th day of August 1869 purchased of the said Luke Crumpton certain lands and executed his three several notes therefor in which said lands are described and afterwards to wit on or about the day of the said Luke Crumpton departed this life intestate and the said Edmund Crumpton party of the second part was by the Probate Court of said County duly appointed administrator upon this estate and has since his appointment brought suit and recovered judgments in his own name as administrator aforesaid upon two of said notes the 1st judgment was returned on the 23rd day of September 1871 for \$132.00 with \$6.35 costs and the other was returned the 4th day of April 1871 for \$153.33 with \$7.50 costs. The other note which is not due until the 25th day of Decr 1871 is for \$125.00 and for a valuable consideration the said parties of the first part has become justly indebted to the said Carter in the sum of six hundred dollars which indebtedness is evidenced by seven promissory notes five at one hundred dollars each, and two for fifty dollars each all bearing even dates therewith and to be due the 25th day of December 1871 of which said Carter has placed four of the one hundred dollar notes and one of the fifty dollar notes in the hands of said party of the second part as collateral security to secure the payment of the two judgments and the notes above described as being due from said Carter to said Crumpton as administrator

aforesaid and the said party of the first-
 part- being desirous to secure the payment
 of the said notes held by the said Commp-
 ion as Collateral security as aforesaid for
 and in consideration thereof and for the
 further consideration of the sum of one
 dollar to the said parties of the first
 part- in hand paid by the said parties
 of the second part the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged the said parties
 of the first part have bargained sold
 and conveyed unto the said party of
 the second part his heirs and assigns
 the following described lands situate in
 said County- The SW¹/₄ of the NW¹/₄ of
 section 7 Township 19 of Range 1 West, also
 the NW¹/₄ of the SW¹/₄ of section 7 Township 19
 Range 1 West. also five acres of the SE¹/₄
 of NW¹/₄ of same section Township and
 Range described as follows running from
 the ~~SW¹/₄~~ SW Corner 20 Rod East thence
 to the N. W Corner to have and to hold
 in trust as follows. It is hereby agreed
 that the said party of the 1st part is to
 have and ~~to have~~ retain possession
 of the said property until the 25th day
 of December 1871 and if the said parties
 of the first part- shall fully pay to the
 said party of the second part said debt
 with interest thereon and the reasonable
 Expenses hereof by said 25th day of Decem-
 ber 1871 then this indenture is to be
 null and void. But upon default of
 such payment the said party of the 2^d part
 is hereby authorized to take into possession
 & sell said property to the highest
 bidder for cash after giving 30 days no-
 tice of the time and place of said sale by
 advertisements posted up at the Court
 house door and three other public
 places in said County and out of
 the proceeds of said sale return the
 debt interest & costs that may be then
 due including the Expenses hereof
 and the balance if any pay to the
