 and Entered into this 22nd day of August 1871
 between Robert Hood & Mc. debtor of the
 first part and H. R. Symonds Serving Part of
 Symonds & Davis Creditor of the 2nd part. Witnesseth
 That whereas the said party of the first part
 is justly indebted to the party of the 2nd part
 in the sum of sixty & 5/100 dollars, due by note
 and payable on or before the 1st day of November
 1871 and the said party of 1st part being desirous
 to secure the payment of said indebtedness
 for and in consideration thereof, and for
 the further consideration of the sum of one
 dollar, to the said party of the 1st part, in
 hand paid by the said party of the 2nd
 part. receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 the said party of the 1st part has sold, and
 hereby sells and conveys to the said party
 of the 2nd part, the following described property
 to wit: One Six Horse Wagon. One Yoke Steers
 one Six year old white. One Speckled seven
 year old to have and to hold, in trust
 it is hereby agreed that the said party of the
 1st part is to have and retain possession
 of the said property until the 1st day of November
 1871 and if the said party of the 1st part shall
 fully pay to the said party of the 2nd part
 said debt with interest thereon and
 reasonable Expenses hereof, by said 1st day
 of November 1871 then this indenture is to
 be made void, But upon default of such
 payment the said party of the second part

is hereby authorized to take into possession and sell said property to the highest bidder for cash after giving fifteen days notice of the time and place of said sale by publication in a newspaper if one published in the County, or by posting at three public places and out of the proceeds of said sale retain the sum of Sixty \$60.00 dollars and interest thereon, and the reasonable costs hereof and the balance if any pay to the said party of the first part signed sealed & delivered this 1st day of Aug^r 1871 ^{his} Robert Hood ^{Mark} of French Harbor
