

Shelby Line to the State of Alabama 3 This indenture
In Shelby County 3 made this 23rd day
of November 1870
Between the "Shelby Line Company" a corporation chartered under the laws of Alabama of the first part, and Mrs Jessie Kelley of the second part, wife of Richard H. Kelley, witness: That whereas the said "Shelby Line Company" on the 4th day of October 1861 procured from John F. McMech and James A. Patterson an assignment of all the interest they had in and to the following described lands to wit, The west half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$), and the South East fraction quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section twenty and (21) Township Twenty two (22), Range (2) the West also the North West

quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the north west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of sec-
 tion one (1), and the south east quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$)
 of the north east quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$), and the north west
 quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the north east quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and
 the north east of the north east quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of
 section two (2) Township twenty four (24)
 Range thirteen East (13), also the north east
 quarter of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section
 twenty (20), and the east half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of south
 west quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section seventeen (17) Town-
 ship Twenty two (22) Range two (2) west,
 all in the County and State aforesaid
 and in the district of land formerly sub-
 ject to entry at Tuscaloosa which lands
 the said Welch and Patterson had pre-
 viously purchased from one Hiram Butler
 and held bonds for title to the same from
 said Butler with the understanding and
 agreement that the said "Shelby Land Com-
 pany" should perfect their title to said
 lands and thereupon should make to the
 said Welch or to his assigns quit claim
 titles to certain portions of said lands
 hereinafter mentioned, and to which said
 lands the said Welch had reserved his
 right and interest in said transfer or
 assignment, and whereas the said Welch
 afterwards to wit, on the 29th day of Sep-
 tember 1863 assigned all his interest
 in said lands which had been reserved
 in the said transfer, and all his right
 under the said Contract, to F. W. Gilmer
 Jr and whereas the said Gilmer afterwards
 to wit, on the 8th day of March 1869 assign-
 ed one undivided fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) interest in
 said lands and Contract to Mrs Jessie
 Kelley - wife of Richard H. Kelley - Now there
 fore know all men by these presents,
 that the said "Shelby Land Company"
 a Corporation as aforesaid in consideration
 of the premises above recited, and for the
 purpose of carrying out the said Contract
 and agreement made with the said
 Welch (as heretofore recited) and his ass-
 igns, and for the further consideration
 of the sum of five (5) Dollars to the said
 Corporation in hand paid by the said
 Mrs Jessie Kelley her heirs and assigns
 all right, title, interest or demand
 of whatever description the said "Shelby
 Land Company" may have in and to
 the following described lands to wit
 one undivided fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) of all that portion

of fractional section Twenty and (21) above
specified which lies northward of the Selma
Rapid & Dalton Rail Road, and eastward of
the traveled road sometimes called the Bear
Kiss road, and also known as the Montgomery
road, and leading towards the old
mill site of the said Welch,

To have and to hold the above described
premises to the said Mrs Jessie Kelley and
her heirs, and to her and them and their
benefit and behoof, forever,

Company to be affixed and attested by the
Secretary of said company the date herein
first above written,
