 This indenture made and entered into this the 8th day of November 1873. between Luke Gilbert party of the first part, and John W. Ataway party of the second part, witnesseth that whereas the said Luke Crumpton is justly indebted to the said John W. Ataway in the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars on promissory note, due on the first day of December 1874 bearing interest from date, and the said Luke Crumpton being willing and desirous of securing the same hath this day given the said John W. Ataway a deed in trust on the following property to wit, one Sorrel Horse about 9 year old, and one black Cow and my entire Crop for 1874 on the place known as the John Ataway place,

Now the Condition of the above obligation is such that if the said Luke Gilbert shall fail to pay the above named note in this deed on or before the first day of December 1874, then the said John W. Ataway shall have power to take the said property named in this deed in possession and sell at public outcry for cash at E.W. Ataway's Store by giving 20 days notice of such sale or so much thereof as will pay the debt and charges, and if the said Luke Gilbert shall pay the above named debt on or before the first day of December 1874 then this obligation to be void, In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this the 8th day of November 1873.
