for and in consideration of my
indebtedness to Green Merrill in the sum of two hundred
Dollars, due by note bearing even date of this indenture
and payable January 1st 1880, now to secure the punctual
payment of said indebtedness, I do hereby sell and con-
vey unto said Green Merrill the following goods and
chattels to wit, one Grey horse 10 years old, one yoke of
oxen both red, and one wagon - two cows and calves,
one sow six shafts & 6 pigs, all household and kitchen
furniture consisting of two Beds & Bedding, one stove
& cooking utensils &c and all the crop grown by me
during the present year, after paying rents &c.

upon condition, however, that if I pay said note to said
Green Merrill or his assigns this deed to be void, but
if I fail to pay said note in whole or in part, at
maturity, then said Green Merrill his agent or
assigns are authorized to take possession of said prop-
erty and after giving ten days notice by posting at
three public places in said county to sell the same to
the highest bidder for cash and the proceeds to devote to
the paying 1st the expenses of advertising and selling
and 2nd the amount with interest that may be due
on said note, and the surplus if any to be turned
over to the undersigned. - In testimony whereof
