 part being indebted to the party of the 1<sup>st</sup> part in the sum  
 of thirty dollars on an open account, due and payable on  
 the 15<sup>th</sup> of October 1878, and the party of the said part being  
 desirous to secure to said 1<sup>st</sup> party said indebtedness do

herely sell and convey to said 1st party in trust, the following property to wit: my entire crop raised by me the present year, and one black cow with white back and belly in trust as follows, it is agreed by the parties that the party of the 2nd part is to retain the possession of said property until the 15<sup>th</sup> of October 1878, and if said debt is not fully paid, the party of the 2nd part may seize said property and after giving ten days notice of the time and place of sale by posting notice at three public places in the county, sell said property to the highest bidder for cash, and retain the amount of said debt and expenses hereof and the balance if any pay to the party of the second part.
