 Jno. W. Ogley indebtedness to John W. Ogley in the sum of Eighty  
 dollars due by our note bearing date January 24<sup>th</sup> 1879  
 and payable Nov 15<sup>th</sup> 1879 now to secure the prompt  
 payment of said indebtedness we do hereby sell and  
 convey to said John W. Ogley the following goods and  
 chattels to wit - One brown horse mule, two cows  
 & calves one steer two years old together our  
 entire crop of corn and cotton to be grown the  
 1879 upon condition however that if we pay said  
 Eighty dollars to said John W. Ogley or his assigns  
 with interest and cost of record this deed to be  
 void but if we fail to pay said note in hole or  
 in part at maturity then said John W. Ogley  
 his agents or assigns are authorized to take possession  
 of said property and after giving ten day notice by  
 posting notices in three public places to sell the  
 same at Public outcry to the highest bidder for  
 cash and the proceeds to devote to the paying 1<sup>st</sup>  
 the expenses of advertising and selling and 2<sup>nd</sup> the  
 amount with interest that may be due on said  
 note and the surplus if any to be turned over  
 to the undersigned In testimony whereof we herein
