The State of Alabama, This indenture made and entered into on
Shelby County, this the 4th day of January 1872 by and between
Mrs Mary A. Morris & her husband Jasper J. Morris who joins with his wife
in this deed for the purpose of enabling his wife Mary A. Morris to con-
vey the following described property it being her separate of the
first part and Wimberly Sparks & Co. of the second part witnesseth
that for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty thousand
dollars paid by said Wimberly Sparks & Co. to the said Mary A.
Morris the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged the party of
the first part do hereby bargain sell and Convey unto the
said Wimberly Sparks & Co. their heirs and assigns forever all
that part of the following described lands lying North & West
of a Stream Called "Camp Branch" to wit - the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of S $\frac{1}{4}$ & the
S $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S.E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29 & the N.E $\frac{1}{4}$ & the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N.W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec-
tion 32 Township 21 Range 1 west except two acres sold to W.W. Boykin
& the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S.E $\frac{1}{4}$ (except two acres) of Section one Township 22.
Range 2 west & the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N.E $\frac{1}{4}$ & the S.W $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N.E $\frac{1}{4}$ & the E $\frac{1}{2}$

in the N.E. corner of Section 12 Township 22 Range 2 west running
north seventy yards West 140 yards, South 70 yards & East 140 yards
also half interest in the $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S.W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6 Township 22 Range
One west all lying and being in said County of Shelby
known as the Shelby Springs excepting acre or more out of
said lands about sixty two (62 $\frac{1}{2}$) & a half acres heretofore Con-
veyed to divers persons for lots at Shelby Springs - also the

lands Conveyed to J. N. Lapsley A. W. White Thomas Colcomb & B. M.
 Right by the party of the 1st part Also saving & reserving out of
 said lands all that part or parcel of land lying immediately
 on the North and west side of the Selma River & Dalton Railroad
 Commencing on a line with a large Hickory tree about sixty yards
 from said Railroad track and running at right angles with
 said Railroad track two hundred yards thence North East
 parallel with the railroad striking "Camp branch" two hundred
 yards above the Railroad bridge thence down Camp Branch
 to said Railroad bridge thence along said Railroad track to
 the place of beginning - The foregoing described lands are Con-
 veyed Subject to a lease heretofore made to Phares & Honeycutt
 under an Order of the Clarendon Court & hereby Conveying
 all such rights privileges and immunities vested, or ac-
 cruing to said May A. Morris under & by virtue of said lease
 to said Phares & Honeycutt of a portion of said lands for fif-
 teen years for the purpose of establishing a Tannery for the manu-
 facture of leather. To have and to hold the said lands rights
 privileges & immunities hereby Conveyed unto the said Wimber-
 ley Sparks & Co. their heirs and assigns forever together with
 the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise
 appertaining and the parties of the first part hereby Cov-
 erant & agree to & with the parties of the second part that
 said lands are free from all incumbrances past or pres-
 ent of every kind and description whatever and that
 they will forever warrant and defend the title to the
 same against the claims or claims of any and all
 persons lawfully claiming the same - Witness our
 hands & Seals this the 4th day of January AD 1872
