said party of the said party of the second part the

more or less in the South west corner of NW 1/4 of
the NW 1/4 Section 5 Township 19 Range 1 west making
a certain branch the line, running east of the
Residence of S. D. Cox, mineral right excepted.

And the party of the first part will forever warrant
and defend the title of the same to the party of the
second part, and to his heirs, representatives and
assigns from every lawful claim whatsoever.
