To all whom these presents shall come greeting: Certificate) Whereas James F. Wooten, of Shelby County Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office, at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made, by the said James F. Wooten, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April, 1820, entitled: "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands"; and the acts supplemental thereto, for the East half of the north East quarter, of section fourteen, in township eighteen south of range two west, of Huntsville meridian, in Alabama, containing eighty acres, and thirty four hundredth of an acre, according to the official Plat, of the Survey of said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased, by the said James F. Wooten, Now, know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given & granted & by these presents do give and grant, unto the said James F. Wooten, and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thenceunto belonging, unto the said James F. Wooten, and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I. Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the thirtieth day of October, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and Eighty two, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundredth and seventh.
