 parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the  
 interest they feel in said children and in their  
 educational welfare, the said parties of the first part  
 do by these presents, give, grant, convey & deliver unto the  
 said parties of the second part their heirs and  
 assigns for the purpose of education, or for a school  
 house site, so long as it is used for that purpose  
 or until the stock holders, or those who contribute  
 to its building unanimously decide that they  
 want it no longer, for that purpose, the following  
 described lot of land to wit: 50 yds. each way  
 from the school house. To have and to hold to the  
 said parties of the second part their heirs and  
 assigns so long as, it is used for school purposes  
 or until those who contribute to the building of the  
 school house, shall unanimously decide that they  
 want it no longer, then it is to revert back to the  
 original tract and the house to be sold to the  
 highest bidder, and the proceeds to be divided  
 between the stock holders in the same ratio  
 that they pay into its building. In witness whereof
