have bargained and sold, and by these presents do
grant, bargain, sell and convey and enfeoff, unto the
said French labors, the following described lands, lying
and being in said County, & State to wit: The West half
of the South ~~West~~ quarter, of section seventeen, in town-
ship twenty one, of Range four west. In the district
of land subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, con-
taining Eighty 10/100 acres to have and to hold unto the
said French labors, his heirs and assigns forever, & the
said parties of the first part covenant with the
and agree, with the said French labors, his heirs and
assigns that they are seized in this demense as of Fee
to and in said land, and they will warrant and forever
defend the same, free from incumbrances to the said
French labors, his heirs and assigns.
