

Harrison Co. The State of Alabama. This Indenture made the 21<sup>st</sup>.  
 A. D. Shelly County. day of April A. D. 1883. Between  
 Brufield Co. one thousand eight hundred & eighty three, between  
 company. Louis L. Harrison as administrator and George T. Harrison  
 as administrator of the estate of Thomas L. Harrison dec'd.  
 and the said Louis L. Harrison the said George T. Harrison  
 & his wife Mary A. Harrison Henry W. Harrison, his wife Fannie  
 Harrison, J. Frank Harrison & his wife Martha Harrison &  
 Sallie Harrison, the heirs at law of the said Thomas Harrison  
 divided parties of the first part, and the Brufield, Coal  
 & Iron Company of Alabama, a body corporate party of  
 the second part witnesseth: Whereas the said Thomas  
 Harrison, in his life time and one Burnell B. Lewis  
 did as partners for the special purpose & for none other  
 equally purchase the following lands, lying & being in  
 said County, to wit:  $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  and SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$

 has agreed with the same party, here of the second part to  
 sell his undivided interest in said land and contents as  
 said surviving partner, that the said parties of the first  
 part, here shall also sell the other undivided interest in  
 said lands, the legal title of me undivided half interest  
 in said land having descended to them on the decease  
 of said Thomas Harrison, And whereas the said Louis L.  
 Harrison and said George T. Harrison have taken out  
 letters of administration on the estate of said Thomas  
 Harrison deceased, and now deem it best for said estate  
 that the heirs thereof shall sell the same, with the  
 consent, of the said surviving partner, and whereas the  
 said heirs, parties here of the 1st part are desirous that  
 said lands, shall be sold: Now in consideration of the

premises, as well as in consideration of the sum of twenty six hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first part, have bargained & sold, & by these presents, do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part one undivided half interest or moiety to and in the following described lands being the lands above described to wit: N<sup>W</sup> of NW<sup>1/4</sup>, & N<sup>W</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup>, and NE<sup>1/4</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup>, and SW<sup>1/4</sup> of SE<sup>1/4</sup> and SE<sup>1/4</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 30 and SE<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 32 and 8<sup>1/2</sup> of NW<sup>1/4</sup> and N<sup>W</sup> of SE<sup>1/4</sup> & SW<sup>1/4</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup> section 33 all in T. 21 R. 4 West and SE<sup>1/4</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 28 same township & Range & N<sup>W</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 24 T. 21 R. 5 W. & SW<sup>1/4</sup> of SW<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 6 & N<sup>W</sup> of NW<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 7 T. 21 R. 4 W. & SE<sup>1/4</sup> of SE<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec 1 and NE<sup>1/4</sup> of NE<sup>1/4</sup> of Sec. 12 T. 21 R. 5 W. containing ten hundred & forty acres, more or less to have and to hold the said undivided half interest or moiety to & in said lands unto the said party of the second part, and its successors and assigns forever, together with all, and singular the rights, easements appurtenances & improvements hereditaments thereto belonging: It being understood that certain agricultural, and surface rights in a portion of said lands in Sec. 30 T. 21 R. 4 W. and in Sec. 24 T. 21 R. 5 W. are owned by other party or parties in subordination to the mining, working and manufacturing said lands for the purpose of mining all minerals and coal deposits, coking & transposing the same, building houses shops etc. roads teams, railroads, ways & gang ways, cutting timber etc. as will more fully appear by the records of Shelby Co. Ala.
