 A.D. 1869 between J. H. Walker and his wife G. M. Walker of the
 State of Alabama and Shelby County of the first part and O.
 D. Dailey, of the same place of the second part. Witnesseth
 that for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred
 Dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of
 the second part at or before the sealing and delivery
 of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 have bargained sold and conveyed and by these presents
 do grant bargain sell enfeoff and convey unto the
 said party of the second part their heirs and assigns
 forever the following designated tract or parcel of
 land lying and being in said Co. Shelby County and
 State aforesaid in the Tuscaloosa Land district to wit:
 The S E $\frac{1}{4}$ of N E $\frac{1}{4}$ and N E $\frac{1}{4}$ of S E $\frac{1}{4}$ & The S W $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N E $\frac{1}{4}$
 of Sec. 35 T 21 R 4 West also the S W $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N W $\frac{1}{4}$ & the
 N W $\frac{1}{4}$ of S W $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 36. Same township & Range containing
 in all Two hundred acres more or less to have and
 to hold the same to his and their only proper use
 and benefit and as for us our heirs and assigns
 will forever warrant and defend the title to the same
 against all persons whatsoever.
