 Ala, to wit: Two acres and a half of land situated in  
 the NE<sup>th</sup> corner of the NW<sup>th</sup> of the SW<sup>th</sup> of Sec No 24, it is large  
 1 West said land is to be a perfect square commencing  
 at said corner take together with all the water power  
 or privileges necessary to carry on said mills and ma-  
 chinery, to have and to hold to said second party, their  
 heirs and assigns forever, the above described and here-  
 by granted premises. And the said parties of the first  
 part husband and wife, hereby covenant with the  
 said party of the second part, that they are lawfully

seized of, and have a good right to sell and convey said land and hereby bind themselves, their heirs and legal representatives forever to warrant and defend the title to said Land and premises to the said party of the second part, their heirs, assigns and legal representatives, against the claim of all and every person in law or equity, and against the Government of the United States.
