Application 11862 — ente shall come, Greeting:
Whereas there has been deposited in the General
Land Office of the United States a certificate of the
Register of the Land Office at Montgomery Alabama
whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Con-
gress approved 20th May 1862, "To secure Homesteads
to actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts
supplemental thereto the claim of John J. Goodwin
has been established and duly consummated in
conformity to law for the North East quarter of
Section fourteen in Township Twenty South of
Range one East of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama
containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and
ninety six hundredths of an acre, according to
the Official Plot of the survey of the said land
returned to the General Land Office by the Sur-
veyor General:

No. 2. Now know ye, That there is therefore granted
by the United States unto the said John J. Good-
win the tract of Land above described: Is have
and to hold the said tract of Land with the ap-
purtuances thereof unto the said John J. Good-
win and to his heirs and assigns forever.

caused these letters to be made Patent and the
seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
Given under my hand at the City of Wash-
ington the sixteenth day of August in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
eighty nine, and of the Independence of the
United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
