The United States of America,
 To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 Homestead Certificate 10624 }
 application 20631 } Whereas there has been
 deposited in the General Land Office of the United
 States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office
 at Montgomery, Alabama, which it appears that,
 pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May,
 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on
 the Public Domain", and the acts supplemental
 thereto, the claim of Eveline Cross has been established
 and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the
 West half of the South West quarter and the North
 East quarter of the South West quarter of Section two
 in Township twenty-four North of range fifteen

East of St. Stephens Meridian in Alabama, containing One hundred and seven acres and fifty two hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Ervine Cross the tract of Land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Ervine Cross and to heirs his and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twenty-ninth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and of the Independence of the United States the One hundred and Sixteenth.
