

 of twenty six (26) Township 21 Range 3 West thence East 20 chains
 thence South 10 chains thence East 24 chains 25 links to
 Spring creek, begin again at the S. W. corner of the aforesaid sub-
 division, thence North 7 chains 88 links to a post thence
 South 87 degrees East 50 chains to Spring creek, thence down
 the creek following the meadows of the same to former
 post on the creek containing sixty acres more or less lying or being in Sec's
 of 25 & 26 of Township 21 Range 3 West.
